



## **How to reduce exposure:**

- Read labels before purchasing - Labels explain how to safely use and store products
- Carefully follow directions on the proper use of the product
- Wear gloves when handling toxic chemicals
- Use in well ventilated conditions
- Keep children and pets away from harmful chemicals
- Choose safer and less toxic chemicals
- Dispose of chemicals at special collections
- Never dump on ground
- Don't stockpile hazardous products.

## Safely Transport Hazardous Materials!

- Leave materials in original contain-ers
- NEVER MIX CHEMICALS
- Tighten caps and lids
- Sort and pack separately
- Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes with newspaper padding
- Avoid spills, do not put items in garbage bags
- Don't SMOKE with chemicals in the vehicle
- Pack your car and drive directly to

- ✓ Moth Balls/Rodent Killers
- ✓ Flea Control Products

### From the Garage:

- ✓ Fuels/Gasoline/Kerosene
- ✓ Engine Degreaser/ Antifreeze
- ✓ Brake Fluid/Carburetor Cleaner
- ✓ Transmission Fluid/Radiator Flush
- ✓ Car Wax, Polishes
- ✓ Driveway Sealer
- ✓ Roofing Tar
