



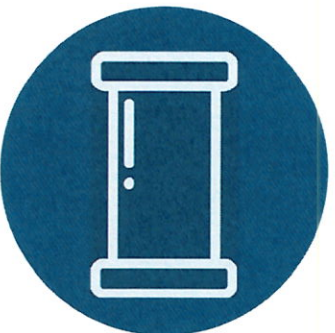

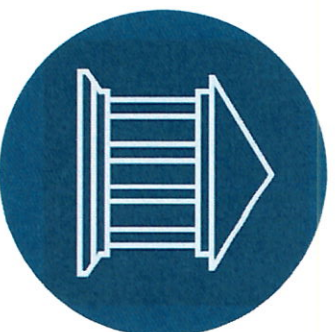

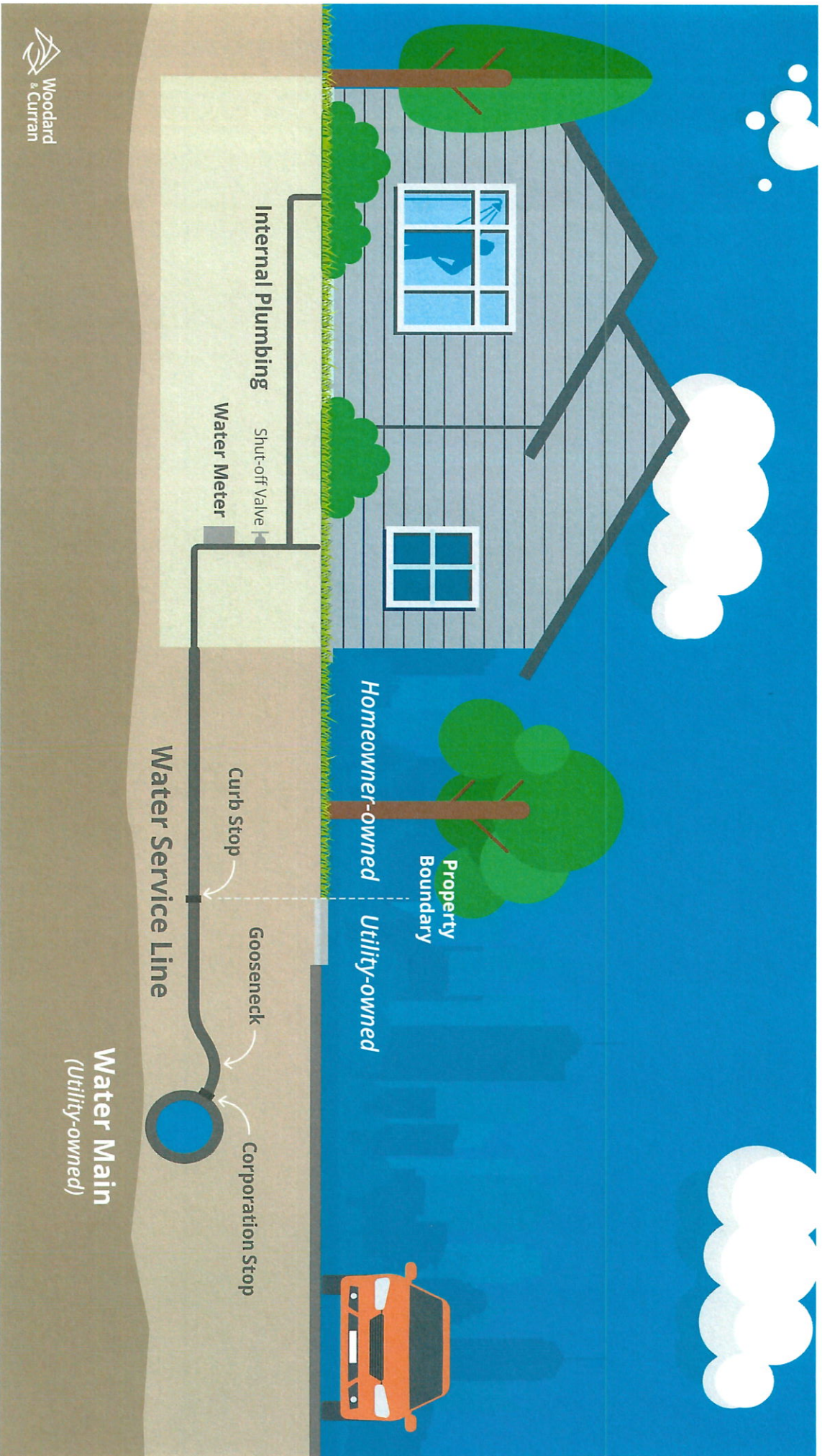

Types of Water Pipes (Service Lines)

LEAD A dull, silver-gray color that is easily scratched with a coin. Use a magnet - strong magnets will not cling to lead pipes.



PLASTIC White, rigid pipe.



BRASS Dark reddish brown to a light silvery color. Older pipes may be corroded and may contain lead.



COPPER The color of a penny.



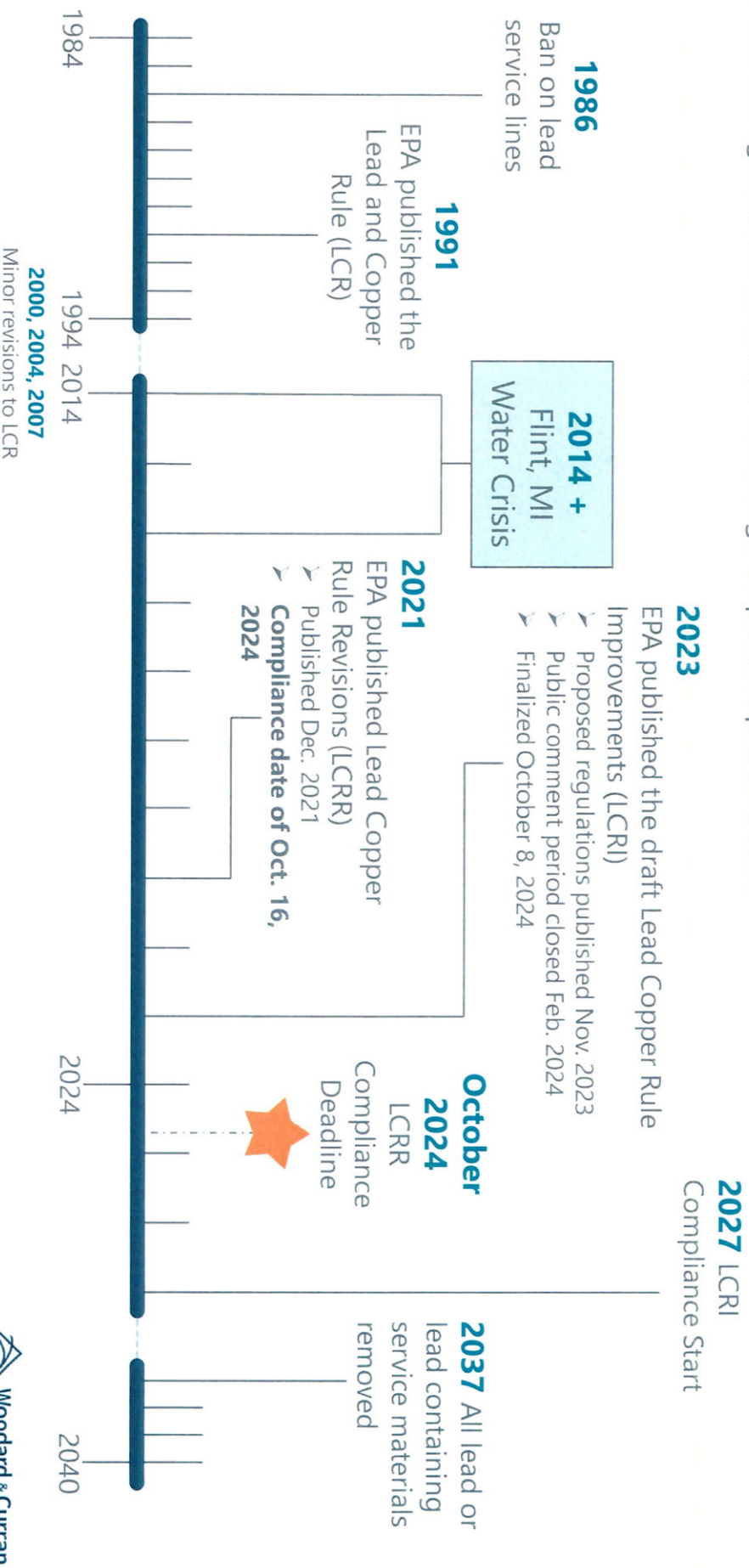
GALVANIZED A dull, silver-gray color. Use a magnet - strong magnets will typically cling to galvanized pipes.

- ▶ New requirements for public notices and outreach



- ▶ Revised replacement requirements and updated plan



- ▶ Revised compliance sampling and procedures



- ▶ Revised Treatment Technique Requirements

Plainville Water Department Actions

- ▶ No Lead Exceedances
- ▶ Service line inventory completed by October 16, 2024
 - 2,508 service lines in the distribution system
 - 16 are known to be lead (Property owners were notified)
 - 721 are of unknown material (Property owners were notified)
 - 1,771 are known not to contain lead (Notification not required)
- ▶ Continuing to monitor for lead as part of required sampling
- ▶ Continue to replace lead services from the main to the meter during planned water main improvement projects
- ▶ Performing inspections
- ▶ Annual notification to property owners with known lead services and unknown service materials

PLAINVILLE DRINKING WATER NOTICE Your home is served by a confirmed lead service line.

This notice contains important information about your drinking water. Have someone translate it for you or speak with someone who understands it.

Dear Customer,

Water systems are now required to inventory all water service line materials and identify any water service line containing lead or lead materials. **Our most recent inventory has determined that a portion of or the entire water pipe (called a service line) that connects your home or building to the water main is made from lead.** Please note the Town's water mains do not contain lead but some water services in the water distribution system consist of lead materials or do not have the service material documented. The Water Department is committed to providing the safest drinking water possible to its customers. Part of that commitment includes notifying customers that have a known lead water service or a water service where the service material is unknown. While the Town's water treatment process protects the pipes to mitigate the potential for lead to leach into the water system and the Water Department regularly test the water system for lead, our goal is to remove any lead pipes from the water system to ensure we provide you with the safest drinking water possible.

PLAINVILLE DRINKING WATER NOTICE Your home is served by a service line that may be lead.

This notice contains important information about your drinking water. Have someone translate it for you or speak with someone who understands it.

Dear Customer,

Water systems are now required to inventory all water service line materials and identify any water service line containing lead or lead materials. Our most recent inventory has determined that a portion of or the entire water pipe (called a service line) that connects your home or building to the water main are of **unknown material classification. Unknown means that the service line could be lead.** Please note the Town's water mains do not contain lead but some water services in the water distribution system consist of lead materials or do not have the service material documented. The Water Department is committed to providing the safest drinking water possible to its customers. Part of that commitment includes notifying customers that have a known lead water service or a water service where the service material is unknown. While the Town's water treatment process protects the pipes to mitigate the potential for lead to leach into the water system and the Water Department regularly test the water system for lead, our goal is to remove any lead pipes from the water system to ensure we provide you with the safest drinking water possible.

As a precaution, here is information on the health effects of lead and steps to reduce your exposure. If your service line is confirmed as lead, the Town will share information on financial help to remove it and replace it with one made of a safer material.

Properties with Confirmed Lead Services Next Steps

► Town of Plainville

- The Water Department will continue to replace lead services encountered during planned water main improvement projects
- The Water Department will replace the portion of confirmed lead services from the main to curb stop/property line (public portion)
- Unless the lead water service is replaced as part of a water main improvement project, the Town will only replace the public portion (main to curb stop) of your water service

► Property Owners

- Review the notification letter you received carefully, including the health effects of lead and steps you can take to reduce exposure to lead
- Hire a licensed contractor to replace your lead water service from the water meter to the curb stop/property line

Properties with Unknown Service Material Next Steps

► Town of Plainville

- The Water Department will continue to replace lead services encountered during planned water main improvement projects
- The Water Department will begin performing in-home meter inspection and pothole inspections of water services where the material type is unknown
- If lead is identified on the public portion of the service (main to curb stop), the Water Department will replace the public portion of the water service.
- If lead is identified on the private portion of the water service, the Town will notify to property owner that the water service has been confirmed to contain lead

► Property Owners

- Review the notification letter you received carefully, including the health effects of lead and steps you can take to reduce exposure to lead
- The Town will be performing a meter replacement program in 2025 that will verify the service material at your water meter connection.
- If your service material is determined to be lead or galvanized pipe during this meter replacement program, the Water Department will notify the property owner.
- Property owners should replace their portion of the water service if it is determined to be lead or galvanized pipe

Multi-Family and Non-Owner Occupied Housing

▶ Property Owners and Property Managers

- Owners of multifamily dwellings, property managers, and property owners that are not the sole occupier of a property need to share the notice they received, and all information contained in the notice, with each person that drinks water at the property.
- You can share this information by posting the notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or by mail
- Once notice has been distributed to all people that drink water at the property, please certify distribution of the notice by completing the form included in the letter and returning the completed form to the Water Department

Information For Multi-Family and Non-Owner Occupied Housing *ATTENTION PROPERTY OWNERS AND PROPERTY MANAGERS:*

The Town of Plainville is required under the Federal Lead and Copper Rules to deliver the enclosed service line notifications to all service line connections classified as lead, galvanized requiring replacement, or containing unknown materials. Our most recent service line inventory indicates the service line at your property is classified as either lead, galvanized requiring replacement, or an unknown material. If you have received this notice and are the Owner and sole occupier of the property (single-family owner-occupied home), the distribution and certification request noted below is NOT necessary.

Please share the enclosed notice with all the other people who drink this water at this address, especially those who may not have received this notice directly (for example, people in apartments, nursing homes, schools, and businesses). You can do this by posting this notice in a public place or distributing copies by hand or mail.

Once you have distributed the notices to all people who drink water at this address, please certify this distribution by filling out the information below and return to the Town of Plainville Water Department by mail or in person utilizing the contact information below.
